IMPORTANT MESSAGE FROM LOBO WING LEADER, DAVID McBRIDE

It has been quite a while since I've written an update so this may be a little lengthy. Last December I took over as Wing Leader again as our previous Wing Leader had to leave the wing for personal reasons. We hope that sometime in the future he'll be able to return to the unit. The other unit officer changes are Scott Witschger moving back into my previous position as Executive Officer and Chuck Swanberg moving into the Maintenance Officer position.

There has been a lot of activity since my last update so I'll try to touch on as many items as possible. In February Scott Witschger and I attended the Staff Winter Conference in Dallas which is the new location for headquarters of the CAF. The new headquarters is very nice and emblematic of a lot of changes in the CAF. The staff has almost doubled in size and the hangar attached to the offices has lots of room. The plan for the entire site is very impressive and eventually will house some aircraft, a maintenance facility and some displays. There have been some changes in personnel also including a new operations officer and maintenance officer.

Two of the breakout sessions that Scott and I attended while at the staff conference dealt with social media and safety. Social media is an extremely important topic for the CAF. It is our best means of reaching out and touching as many people as possible and getting our message out. Two of the ones that are pertinent to us are Facebook and our website. I know a lot of you are shaking your head right now saying "what is Facebook?" and/or "no way am I getting on Facebook!". It is open source and for the most part has unrestricted content and as such is subject to a LOT of opinion. What's important to us is it is an important advertising tool. All I can say is you need to consider getting on Facebook....it's not that bad. The other important tool we have is our website. Right now our site, Lobowing.org, is undergoing a lot of changes as we are moving to a different server and updating the site. Hopefully, we'll have it finished sometime in September.

The other very important topic as I stated above is SAFETY. The insurance representative for the company the CAF uses spent over an hour covering liability. Last year alone the CAF was responsible for thousands of dollars (one lawsuit was over \$150,000 involving a CAF member) in insurance claims from injuries related to working in our hangars/facilities. Not one of these injuries was documented by any of the wings and completely blindsided the CAF and the insurance company! Last week at our Saturday morning meeting we discussed a lot of these issues and pointed out how important it is that any time anyone has an injury of any kind it must be documented. We are putting up a clipboard right outside the door to the kitchen that has the forms that are required by the CAF.

The other item we discussed was safety in general in our hangar. Remember, our facility is a restoration facility and as such we do a lot of maintenance that could be hazardous. It was stressed in our meeting that anytime there is a project going on that could be construed as hazardous there needs to be a team meeting and there has to be a team leader who is in charge of the evolution. Having said that, it is important to note that everyone is a safety officer in our hangar. Any time anyone sees something unsafe SAY SOMETHING! Also, we have designated all work areas in our hangar as "Authorized personnel only" areas so that only those people who are members are allowed in those spaces. It's important that all members take the time to politely explain to any non-member the reason for us taking these precautions. We cannot afford, financially or emotionally, to suffer any catastrophes in our hangar.

The aircraft in the Lobo Wing have been keeping everyone very busy. If you haven't been to the hangar in a while you will notice some dramatic changes especially with the AT-11. Scott will address all those changes in the next issue of the Chatter, but suffice it to say there has been tremendous progress and you need to come to the hangar to see it all! As for the PT-26 we've had quite a few challenges. The new engine we installed early last year was running well and then we changed to detergent oil after the initial break in. We went from ½ quart/hour to over 3 quarts/hour and the plugs started fouling. After some extensive trouble shooting and expert consultation we decided to go back to mineral oil and the usage has dropped a little but still not where we want it to be. We're still trouble shooting and have confidence we are on the right track and expect to get the usage and plug fouling under control soon.


